## TADA! CURRICULUM OPTIONS FOR SCHOOLS

### **1. Gotta Sing! Gotta Dance! Skill-Building Curriculum:**

Creativity takes center stage in this perfect blend of musical theater exploration and fun theater games that will keep students creative and active all semester long! This curriculum balances the process of skills development in the areas of singing, dancing, and acting, helping students to strengthen their language, movement, and socio-emotional skills in one fell swoop – but the ultimate super power of musical theater is its ability to infuse a classroom with JOY!

#### How it Works:

- **Length:** 8 - 16 sessions
- **Group size:** Up to 30 students per class
- **Grades:** PreK-grade 12, all ages and abilities.
- **Topics & Song Selections** can be chosen based on specific academic subjects, a school core value, students developmental needs, and/or class-specific interests.
- **Culminating Event:** All residencies conclude in a **final sharing** where students present musical numbers from various Broadway hits and TADA! original productions, showcasing the skills they have learned in the program!

#### What Students Will Do:

- Explore musical theater, learning vocals & choreography to fun, upbeat songs from Broadway musicals and TADA!'s original musicals designed for young voices.
- Receive individualized attention and opportunities to shine - no matter what kind of learner they are!
- Receive ensemble-based instruction from two professional NYC teaching artists
- Build connections & community with their peers
- Enhance their abilities to collaborate, communicate, and create!

### **2. Write On! Playbuilding Curriculum:**

Through musical theater training, improvisation, storytelling, and good old-fashioned fun, students work as an ensemble to devise an original mini-musical! Using a popular story or a show title as inspiration, students explore the core components of narrative storytelling, character development, and the power of student voice. In each class session, students will participate in musical theater training and the process of playmaking.

#### How it Works:

- **Length:** 15-20 sessions
- **Group size:** Up to 30 students per class
- **Grades:** Grades 4-12
- **Topics** can be chosen based on specific academic subjects, a school core value, students developmental needs, and/or class-specific interests.
- **Culminating Event:** All residencies conclude in a **final sharing** where students perform their very own mini-musical for a live audience!

#### What Students Will Do:

- Identify the elements of story structure, (characters, setting, conflict, resolution, etc.)
- Explore their own interests and identities.
- Create their own original script, infusing relevant songs from Broadway musicals!
- Learn about acting, singing, and dancing as they rehearse and perform their original mini-musical!
- Receive individualized attention and opportunities to shine - no matter what kind of learner they are!
- Receive ensemble-based instruction from two professional NYC teaching artists
- Build connections & community with their peers
- Enhance their abilities to collaborate, communicate, and create!
