

Letter From Nina

Fiscal Year 2020 started out fun, exciting, and successful for TADA! with more people in classes and coming to see shows than we saw the year before. Both earned, and unearned income was exceeding budget projections. TADA! was lucky — we produced two productions and held our Annual Gala before the COVID-19 shutdown. We also signed a 5-year lease extension at a rent that was much more than what we were paying but still below market value also before the shutdown. Well, two out of three isn't bad. I'm saying this because who wants to pay rent on a space that sits empty in Manhattan.

TADA! is a 36-year-old Musical Theater
Company, and dance is a vital part of what we
do. However, we were caught off-guard by the
Pandemic Pivot — had never heard of it. We're
in luck again, TADA! knows how to improvise,
so on March 15th, that's what we did —
improvised our Pandemic Pivot. Classes, Camps,
New Works Development Workshops, Rehearsals
and Readings, Teen-led Forums, streaming
past Productions, Song and Dance lessons for
the Public, Cabarets, Parties, Private Lessons,
Parent Meetings and Teaching Artist Training all
continued on Zoom or YouTube

I grew up loving Musical Theater. I would

spend a lot of time in my room and sing along with Broadway show albums. One song I loved when I was a teen was "Carousel," from Jacques Brel is Alive and Well and Living in Paris. I had been comparing this past year to a roller coaster ride, but I hate those even before they start. I always liked Carousels and Ferris Wheels. I realize that this year has been much more like those rides because good things have happened while we're going up and down and while the whole world madly turns.

We've also been dealing with another Pandemic — systemic racial injustice, and this one has been going on longer than COVID-19. TADA!'s staff, Board, Ensemble, and families are working to make TADA! an anti-racist **organization**. This work started last year and is continuing now and will take time. We are proud that since the inception of TADA!, a majority of Black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC) families are being served on our stage, in the audience and in our school programs. However, we can not say that is true for our staff or Teaching Artists, Playwrights, Composers and Lyricists. That must be changed, and we are committed to changing these failings. More on our anti-racist work can be read in this report.

"Carousel" is followed by "If We Only Have Love." (I actually didn't remember that until I listened to the album again recently). This song inspires me, and I hope it will also inspire you. Here are just some lyrics that are important to me — "If we only have love/To embrace without fears/We will kiss with our eyes/We will sleep without tears/If we only have love/With our arms open wide/Then the young and the old/Will stand at our side/...Then we'll have a way out/If we only have love/We can reach those in pain/We can heal all our wounds.../And then give the new world/To our daughters and sons.

I started TADA! to bring all different kinds of people together to create and learn from each other, make growing up easier, and make the world a better place for all. I still want to do that, and I hope that you will join me to do just that.

The following pages will enlighten you more about what Fiscal Year 20 was like at TADA!. I usually end by saying I look forward to seeing you all in the theater soon. However, I can not say soon right now. I can say that **TADA! will be back** in the theater in the future, and at that time, I do hope to see you there, but until then, we have Zoom!

It was most important to the staff of TADA! that we found ways to continue our mission to serve NYC youth with musical theater programs that provide them with creative outlets, **friendships** with peers and **support** from **caring** adults, **stability**, leadership opportunities and **fun**. **4,572 families watched 8 past original productions** on TADA!'s YouTube channel — **42% growth** in the number of families that saw productions over the previous summer

Education Summer Camps held on

Zoom had students from all over the world, including Wisconsin, Rhode Island, Illinois, Kansas, Connecticu,t, Massachusetts Pennsylvania, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, California, New York State, New Jersey, Texas, Arizona, Hawaii, and Japan!

No child was turned away — **24 scholarships** were provided to BIPOC students totaling \$19,080.

BLM Movement & TADA!'s stance on Equity & Anti-Racism

- Staff attended various Diversity,
 Equity, Inclusion & Justice
 training and webinars.
- BLM resources for youth and families shared on website and social media platforms.
- Created ongoing teen-led forums to allow RYET Members to talk, be heard, and address their feelings and concerns.
- Created the Arts for All Initiative, providing full-tuition for BIPOC students to musical theater camps
 No students were turned away!
- Developed the Arts Mentorship Program (AMP) for BIPOC Teen Ensemble Members to amplify non-performing careers in theater and match them with professional BIPOC theater mentors.
- Devised **new recruitment process** for Staff and Artists.

- Made a commitment to change the make-up of our staff, consultants, designers, Teaching Artists, Writers, and Board.
- Committed to sourcing and using Black (or BIPOC) - owned and operated businesses.
- Began Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Justice Plan and Commitment.



ZOOM SUMMER CAMP



- Served over 1,975 students directly (PreK-HS) at 24 different schools.
- Served 300 students over 24
 weeks of On-Site Classes during
 fall and winter.
- Another 79 students served remotely in the Spring.
- Provided 15 online musical theater summer camps to over 135 students ages 4 to 12. Summer Camps took on an entirely new look due to COVID and were a complete success!

PRE-COVID EDUCATION PROGRAM



Due to COVID-19, earned income was lower than expected, but we were also able to lower expenses. Thanks to many individuals' support and a special emergency relief grant from The New York Community Trust The NYC COVID-19 Response & Impact Fund, TADA! is happy to report that contributed income came in above the budgeted goal. At this time, we are

projecting the Fiscal Year 20 unaudited deficit at \$104,000. TADA! also received a PPP Loan and an EIDL Loan from the government. These loans allowed TADA! to pay rent for its theater and offices, and keep year-round full and part-time staff employed through the end of the fiscal year. To Note: TADA! would have ended Fiscal Year 20 with a surplus if the PPP loan was forgiven in Fiscal Year 20.

Since doing TADA! my son is more outgoing. He used to hate writing but because of the improv classes he has been more imaginative. He's actually written an outline for a tv show he would like to do. . . and he's only seven. Thank you so much for all you do for the kids!!
