HIGHLIGHTS OF RYET PROGRAMMING

Positive Youth Development Programming and Classes

In September we held our **Beginning of Year Meeting**, which updated all RYET members on the goings on at TADA! for the season. **Assessments were held**, where RYET members learned a song and dance combination, performed those as well as scenes in front of RYET staff. **At members' private meetings** (which ran through November) yearly plans of which activities and productions members wanted to participate in were created based on **assessments and members goals**. Members were provided **free audition prep** for middle and high schools and **classes in dance, acting, singing, improvisation, and script analysis** were held throughout the year. Our training & high expectations **foster positive work habits & help develop skills** [leadership, accountability, creativity, collaboration, & interpersonal adeptness].

Family and Social Events

Throughout the year, **TADA! hosted several family gatherings and social events for RYET members** to foster connection and community such as Halloween Hangout Time (HOT), Winter Holiday HOT, and a teen get together with visiting theater students from UK's Priestland School. The annual Jones Beach Excursion and Parent Town Halls **offered additional opportunities for families to gather and support one another**. TADA! also partnered with Champion Charities for a special trip to see Broadway's *Back to the Future*, including a **backstage tour with actor Hugh Coles**. I've only been at TADA! for 3 months, but it feels like I've been here for like...10 years because everyone is so welcoming. It feels like everybedy welcomed me so fast and it feels like I was instantly part of the one big crazy happy hardworking family." JENESIS HURLEY,

Community Service, Job Readiness Apprenticeship Program (JobRAP), and Arts Mentorship Program (AMP)

Apprentice and Principal RYET members each completed **6–12 hours of community service** at TADA!. 2 RYET members took advantage of **JobRAP** (Production Assistant for *B.O.T.C.H.* and Teaching Assistant for a school break camp). 3 RYET members completed their **AMP menteeship** in December, studying composition, stage management, and directing. A panel was held in June with **9 arts professionals for RYET members** to get to know the day-to-day operations of each artist, how they approach different jobs, and what skills they can learn from each mentor that are transferable to other areas.

Auditions, Rehearsal, and Offsite Performance Opportunities

Auditions for new members were held in Fall, Spring, and Summer. To help provide more performance programming opportunities over the summer, we started rehearsals for the first show of our 2024–2025 season, The History Mystery, Book by Janine Nina Trevens, Music by Eric Rockwell, Lyrics by Margaret Rose. RYET members also participated in one offsite performance at TADA!'s 39th Anniversary Celebration, where they performed 4 musical numbers. They were adored by everyone who attended and were an incredible part of the event.

This jazz-styled musical follows 7 youth on the NYC subway who get lost underground and meet artistic rats, members of B.O.T.C.H. (Bureau of Turmoil, Chaos & Headaches), and find themselves in the basement of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The cast included 25 RYET members aged 9–16, 6 of whom were making their debut, and 3 RYET members served on the crew in roles such as Production Assistant (paid through JobRAP), Assistant to the Choreographer, and Dance Captain.

- B.O.T.C.H. was seen by 1,317 youth and adults over 20 performances and streamed for 5 weeks to 31 families.
- **80% of the cast** and **59% of the crew** were BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, disabled, low-income, and/or immigrants.
- **3 RYET alumni** contributed to the production as Assistant Director, Props Design Assistant, and Box Office Manager.
- School Day Performances served 237 students from P.S. 33, P.S. 250, Bronx Park Middle School, and P.S. 70 for a discounted \$10 ticket price.

EDUCATION PROGRAMMING

On-site Programming

In FY24, TADA!'s Education Department offered a wide-range of year-round musical theater programming, including 12 weekly semester classes, 19 week-long summer camps, 4 weeklong school break camps, 15 Broadway-themed 1-day camps, and 4 open houses. Together, these programs enriched the lives of approximately 1,166 young people, ages 4–12.

ARTS FOR ALL

TADA! believes that no child should be turned away because of their inability to pay. In FY24, we proudly provided **\$54,230 in full-tuition sponsorships** to 82 students, along with **\$7,295 in partial sponsorships** to 22 more, ensuring **104 young people** could experience the joy of our classes and camps.





SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

TADA! continued its impact across all five boroughs, reaching over 3,900 students through 175 in-school residencies and after-school programs at 22 schools. Among these, 5 were funded by CASA (Cultural After-School Adventures), 1 by the Cultural Immigrant Initiative, 2 by the Staten Island Foundation, and 1 through the Arts for Multilingual Learners and Students with Disabilities grant.

NEW PARTNERSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

THE STATEN ISLAND FOUNDATION

Thanks to the generosity of the Staten Island Foundation, TADA! brought musical theater to 350 students at P.S. 65 and P.S. 22, many of whom were experiencing the arts for the first time. At P.S. 22, we continued our work with kindergarten and 2nd-grade students. At P.S. 65, we launched an exciting two-year project to establish the "P.S. 65 Theater Company," guiding staff, students, and the community through the full process of staging The Lion King Jr., from preproduction and auditions to opening night. Both schools saw significant social-emotional growth, including boosted confidence, a stronger sense of community, and improved teamwork.

CULTURAL IMMIGRANT INITIATIVE

TADA! was excited to launch a new program fostering artistic expression and personal growth among migrant and asylum seeker students from Linden Tree Elementary. Through the transformative power of musical theater, we provided a platform for students to discover and amplify their voices while exploring themes of identity, belonging, and resilience. TADA! staff and teaching artists observed significant social and emotional growth, particularly as many students learned songs in both Spanish and English, enhancing their language skills. Ultimately, the program empowered these young individuals to embrace their unique identities, build selfconfidence, and navigate challenges with resilience and grace.
